The canal was engineered to link the HOLLOWAY WOLLASTON coal fields to the Staffs and Worcester canal at Stourton. **STOURBRIDGE** There is no shortage of stories on this walk like concrete narrow boats, glassworks now museums, Wearhouse's for hops, the Dock conservation area, the story of miners headhunted to work the mines in Canada and what
